
Around The World In Black & White 31st March – 20th May






26th May – 15th July

An exhibition by dot-art Artist Members

A new exhibition at dot-art, 'Reflections' is open to the viewer's interpretation of the word. Some may envision sky reflected in bodies of water, mirror images or perhaps are drawn to a more personal reading of inward-looking moments of reflection. The artists in this exhibition have interpreted the theme through these various lenses and offer up their diverse artistic approaches through portraiture, landscape and photography to support the viewer's own contemplation of what 'Reflections' mean to them.

Paying homage to the classic still life genre of art, the artists in this exhibition The Kitchen Table capture the stillness and beauty of this style. The Kitchen Table features quiet still lives of homely, domestic settings and the peaceful moments found in them. As a central focal point of the home, the kitchen table hosts solo dinners, family meals and conversation over cups of tea. A place of exchange and production of meals, food and memories. Race, Dereli, Ashcroft and Kamalian compose simple scenes focusing on arrangement of objects, colour and form.

The exhibition 'Icons' is a star-studded celebration of the pop culture icons of our time, featuring portraits of influential 20th and 21st Century figures from the worlds of music, film and more. Juliet's eye catching, vivacious portraits of pop culture icons are created in her distinctive vivid style, with vibrant acrylic paint and bold, energetic brush marks to capture the very essence, personality and life force of these adored legends.

Juliet paints portraits in acrylics using vibrant colours, aiming for the painting to almost leap off the page. Portraits to exhilarate, invigorate, and capture moments in time, inspired by pop culture, fashion history and the rich, tropical colours of her childhood living in Papua New Guinea. She brings you paintings full of energy, life and joy to uplift your heart.

An exhibition by John Petch

John Petch, born in Liverpool now living in Cheshire, trained to teach art in Liverpool, working in a number of local schools. He says: "My work investigates the relationship between line and space. Challenging how the brain perceives and makes sense of the difference between what is understood and unfamiliar. I began painting in the mid 1960s moving from Op Art to Geometrical Abstraction being inspired by geometric imagery and pattern. My paintings invite the viewer to be drawn into a conversation from a simple statement of pattern to the relationship between art and mathematical special awareness."

Displayed work for this exhibition covers the period from 2014 to the present.





























Liverpool Art Fair

Liverpool Art Fair 2023 took place at the Royal Liver Building from 30th June – 20th August, after a 4 year break due to COVID. It was our biggest event to date, with work from 175 local artists taking over two huge spaces in the iconic building. Almost 40% of exhibiting artists sold work, and sales were our best yet; up 18% on 2019, despite the event being 8 weeks rather than 12!













There was also an extensive events programme, with talks for art lovers, hands on workshops for the general public and advice and inspiration sessions for artists.

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


Media Partner:


• Film to Share

The Liverpool Plinth 2023

A new sculpture working as a meditation on the ongoing conflict in Ukraine has been unveiled on The Liverpool Plinth. Boy with knife Carnation by Wirral based artist Brigitte Jurack is the sixth sculpture to be installed onto the Plinth.

Boy with knife Carnation is a piece originally conceived as a meditation on the potential of violence. The knife in the original sculpture is replaced with a carnation, which will be replaced to change colour throughout the year. In Ukrainian culture, different coloured carnations are used to symbolise different feelings and emotions. Red carnations, for example, are given on 8 May to veterans, white are given as a sign of pure love and pink to mothers to celebrate undying love.

Artist Brigitte Jurack says: "I am honoured to see this sculpture in the public realm at St. Nicholas Church. The contemporary hooded boy is at the threshold to adolescence, a time of turmoil and uncertainty. His pose represents uncertainty: How will he remain on the path of peace in the light of external and internal conflict?"

The Liverpool Plinth is a public art partnership between Liverpool BID Company, dot-art and Liverpool Parish Church. Boy with knife carnation is the latest sculpture to be installed onto the Plinth, helping to enrich public spaces within Liverpool's Culture & Commerce BID Area. Established in 2018, The Liverpool Plinth is located at the Grade II listed Liverpool Parish Church, the Church of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas, and is managed together with Liverpool BID Company and dot-art.













Artist in Residence at the Everyman

Our second pair of Artists in Residence, Tommy Graham and Kirsten Todd, undertook their residency for 6 months from October 2022, and an exhibition of their work took place from $17^{th} - 29^{th}$ April.















Art in the Ev

As part of our work with the Everyman, we also curate a rolling programme of local artists work in a new exhibition space on the first floor at the Everyman. Art in the Ev is open to individuals and groups, exhibitions will last between 2 to 6 weeks, with art work on display available to buy through the street cafe. The hire fee is £100 per 2 week block.

Studio Update

Our new studios, right in the heart of Liverpool city centre, in Lord Street are now full!

The studios are open to both member and non-member artists of dot-art. There are a variety of spaces, including private rooms, larger rooms which can be split or shared, and open plan spaces. The space can be accessed 24 hours a day and is close to bus and rail stations. It is on the second floor, with lift access as well as stairs. Sizes are flexible, and contracts are on a month-by-month basis. Studios start at just £85+VAT per month for dot-art members and £95+VAT for non-members.
