



Degrees of Abstraction

15th September – 18th November

Degrees of Abstraction brings together three abstract artists, Hilary Dron, Jessica Slack and John Sharp; each pushing the boundaries of gestures, geometric and natural forms. Abstract art can trick the human eye, as it searches for form and representation, and unlike figurative art, can evoke emotions through colour and shape. This show of large, vibrant paintings closes the door on reality and centres you in the realms of abstraction.

Featuring Stu Henderson, Mike Goodwin and Charlotte Weatherstone.



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

An exhibition by Rob Edmondson


Rob Edmondson presents realistic countryside scenes of flowing rivers, shaded forests, boatyards, and fields of barley. "My work is landscape based. I revel in the physical manipulation of the paint and experimenting with unusual techniques to gain evocative effects. Implicit in each painting is the use of light, colour, depth and movement. Much of my work is based on the landscape of the North of England although I always produce artwork based on my travels around the world."

The 12th dot-art Schools programme launched in September and this year we have over 90 schools from across the Liverpool City Region taking part. After last year's successful pilot, we are also thrilled to have signed a three year agreement with the Walker Art Gallery to host the annual exhibition in June.

• Art Bytes

The third Art Bytes national schools programme was also launched in September, and we have a record 99 schools from across the country taking part this year.

We have secured a three year partnership with the University of Liverpool, which will be a huge help in ensuring the growth of our reach and impact, as well as providing students with valuable work experience.

We also have two new exciting venue partners for 2024; Kettles Yard in Cambridge for the East of England (pictured below) and the Shipley Art Gallery, Gateshead for the North East.






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• Artist in Residence at the Everyman and Playhouse

Our fifth Artist in Residence was Ali Barker, who worked within the theatres creating new work from September 2023 - February 2024, and an exhibition of her work, entitled "Two Theatres, One Vision" took place from 13 - 23 March 2024.













• Art in the Ev

As part of our work with the Everyman, we also curate a rolling programme of local artists work in a new exhibition space on the first floor at the Everyman. Art in the Ev is open to individuals and groups, exhibitions will last between 2 to 6 weeks, with art work on display available to buy through the street cafe. The hire fee is £100 per 2 week block.

Dates for 2024 were booked up incredibly quickly, so we also released dates for the first half of 2025 which have now also all booked up! The following members will be showing their work:






• Tree Story at Liverpool ONE

On Friday 16th February a 20-metre-long art display on School Lane and multiple tree integrated displays on Paradise Street were unveiled showcasing photographs, stories and poems about trees submitted by residents across the region. The images and stories have been submitted via Tree Story, a project set up by Open Eye Gallery and dot-art back in 2020 during lockdown.

We invited people living in the Liverpool City Region to take photographs of trees that were special to them in some way and submit their story explaining why, which were then uploaded to an interactive map. Now, we are working with Liverpool ONE to showcase a selection of these stories (including by dot-art Member Alice Lenkiewicz) and encourage visitors to get involved themselves.

Passers-by can scan the QR code shown on the pop-up exhibition and on trees along Paradise Street to submit their own pictures of trees relating to their family histories, memories, and daily lives. The display will remain until May 2024.


















• The Flower Streets Murals
