






















Featuring dot-art Artists Amanda Oliphant, Felice Beilin and Rachel McArdle.



Liverpool Art Fair



Liverpool Art Fair returned to the landmark Royal Liver Building on the Pier Head to celebrate its 11th year in the summer of 2025, building on the remarkable success of last year's 10th anniversary event. Liverpool Art Fair welcomed thousands of art lovers across 6 and a half weeks from 11th July – 25th August, showcasing the work of almost 200 selected local artists and opening 7 days a week for the first time in the event's history, delivering our most successful fair to date!

Key Facts 2025:

- Liverpool Art Fair 2025 ran for 46 days and was open to the public, free of charge, 7 days a week, staffed 11am-5pm.
- It was located in The Royal Liver Building, the city's most iconic landmark.
- We showcased the work of 191 local artists.
- Sales were up 61% on 2024.
- Over 250 artworks were sold, an increase of 39%.
- Over 50% of the artists on show sold work.
- The Private View event saw us welcome almost 500 guests.
- Almost 9000 people visited the event over the summer, an increase of 83% on 2024.

























dot-art Schools

In the academic year 2024-25, dot-art Schools' thirteenth annual programme continued to be a highlight in the academic calendar for schools across the Liverpool City Region. 1350 young people participated from 84 schools, with a fantastic 16 new schools coming on board; meaning we have now worked with over 14,500 students since the start of the project. We were absolutely delighted to once again hold our annual Prize Giving Event in the Concert Room at the stunning St Georges Hall, with the exhibition in the prestigious Walker Art Gallery displaying the winning works from all participating local primary and secondary schools.

Art Bytes

In the academic year 2024-25, Art Bytes' 4th annual programme continued to grow and develop across England, with almost 2500 young people participating from 150 schools; a 50% increase from last year, meaning we have now worked with almost 7000 students since the start of the project.




Art in the Ev










• The Flower Streets Murals

dot-art Artist Madeleine Pires continues to work on the long running Flower Streets Mural project. After painting 8 murals in 2023 and 3 in 2024, she completed the twelfth and final mural in September 2025, meaning the whole street has now been transformed!













Poets Park Bollards

In summer 2025, dot-art were commissioned by Regenerus to work with them in Poets Park in Bootle to transform a number of unsightly bollards. Artist Madeleine Pires, famous for her Flower Streets murals, was selected to work with residents and locals to paint poems and flowers onto a total of 26 bollards, providing splashes of colour and hopeful words to the community for many years to come.


























Onward Homes Mural



Local Nature Recovery Plan Schools Project

Artist Joe Venning was commissioned by Liverpool City Region Combined Authority to work with six secondary schools (one in each LCR borough) to create artwork showcasing the diverse range of wildlife to be found in their area. These illustrated maps are then to be included in the forthcoming LCR Local Nature Recovery Strategy document and used in associated engagement activity.

The project was launched with an exhibition at Open Eye Gallery, and an event on 1st September, to which all the students and teachers who had been involved were invited, as well as Joe the artist and various stakeholders.



























• Clatterbridge Corridor Commissions

Over the past 12 months, dot-art has worked alongside Clatterbridge Cancer Centre, who commissioned three of our artists to produce new work for the ward corridors. Patients and staff collaborated to choose both the artists and the subject matter in these uplighting pieces that now bring calm, colour and inspiration to those receiving and delivering care every day. Congratulations to Frank Leung, Hilary Dron and Lorna Morris.

















Clatterbridge Teenage and Young Adult Ward

We were also commissioned to breathe new life into the recently transformed Teenage and Young Adult area at Clatterbridge, by designing a large-scale vinyl to cover the walls. Artist Olga Snell went through an intensive consultation period with young people using the space and the results are simply transformative!



























Porsche NOW Pop Up in Liverpool ONE

In June we were asked to collaborate with Porsche as they brought a pop up space to Liverpool ONE for a month. They commissioned artist Jessica Arrowsmith Stanley (AKA Jazz Stan) to produce a mural on the outside of their space, created an Art Wall which displayed the work of a new local artist each week (Hilary Dron, Neale Thomas, Vivienne Netherwood and Joao Coelho) and asked us to help deliver free creative workshops across the month, led by Chris Routledge and Frank Leung.



























• Salt and Tar / Sefton Fostering Commission










Young Artist Membership Awards

Following the launch of our new Young Artist Membership for 18-25 year olds in April, in June we were delighted to award three prizes to Fine Art Graduates at both Liverpool John Moores and Liverpool Hope University, giving each artist one year free membership of dot-art. These will now be annual awards and will also be extended to the City of Liverpool College in 2026.















Art Classes

Over the summer, we made the very difficult decision to pause our art class programme after 12 years of continuous delivery. Sadly, bookings have been steadily declining in recent years, meaning many course cancellations (inconvenient for tutors, participants and organisers), increased workload and ever decreasing returns. We may return to these in the future, but for now there is simply too much competition in the city.

Studio Update

Our Lord Street artists' studios, right in the heart of Liverpool city centre, in Lord Street remain full, with a large waiting list.

Our Royal Liver Building studios, launched earlier this year, also remain full.

We are still looking for a third studio site and members will be the first to know if we are able to secure this!

Artists' Social

On 7th August, we held our bi-annual dot-art Member Artists Social event, at Rudys on Castle Street. Over 30 artists attended, with members also bringing along potential new artists who would like to find out more about working with us, and feedback was excellent. We will continue to hold these events every 6 months, alternating with Artists' Forums; the next one will be early in the new year.

dot-art's 20th Birthday!

In January 2026 we will be celebrating a huge milestone – dot-art's 20th anniversary! We would love your ideas for how we should celebrate, and we would like as many of you as possible to get involved, so do get in touch with any ideas or suggestions! Celebrations will continue for the first 4 months of 2026.

We will be having a short film made (by the 1st winner of the dot-art Schools Programme, James Murphy!) to mark the occasion, plus members and staff have come up with some great ideas so far, some of which we are planning to implement, including:

- 20x20 Exhibition at dot-art Gallery members are invited to submit an artwork measuring 20x20cm, ensuring that we are able to show lots of different artists
- TWENTY Exhibition at INNSiDE we will aim to show 20 large scale works by 20 different artist members in a space which usually only holds solo shows.
- o 20% for 20 years one day / one week sale to generate sales.
- 20 Stories for 20 years artists, clients, partipocants and the public are asked to share a story or memory about dot-art. These will be collated and shared on socials trhoughour the celebrartions.

- John Petch sold 3 large scale works to a corporate client.
- o Richard Farrell, Martin Jones, John Petch and Jane Adams had work selected for the refurbishment of the Tune Hotel.
